



## Pupil Premium



As you will be aware, the Government give funding to schools for all children entitled to free school meals. This amount works out at approximately £1,300 per eligible pupil.

We try to ensure that the money is spent wisely and that all our children at Busill Jones Primary School benefit from the additional funding. This is how we spent our Pupil Premium Allocation in **2011/12 £45,221**

- We gave £4000 to resource our Irresistible Curriculum which has inspired our children with their writing, particularly the boys.
- We gave £4000 for the purchase of EYFS resources.
- We purchased new RML books for our reading scheme to help raise reading standards across the school.
- We partially funded the salary of two part time teachers to support those children across the school who needed additional support in maths and literacy skills.
- We funded a teaching assistant to provide extra help for nurture groups and mentoring for children with emotional needs.
- We provided funding for Rock It tuition groups and their music exams at Forest Arts Centre and also subsidised our after school dance sessions as we feel that the Arts are a wonderful way to excite and enthuse children.
- We provided pupils from Year 1 to Year Six with a theatre and workshop experience, to help enrich their vocabulary and provide memorable learning experiences through the medium of drama which would in turn enrich their literacy experiences.
- We also subsidised ALL school visits and will continue to do so this year. Our school values life experiences and our staff know how much the children gain from visits to aid their learning.
- We employed Sports Plus to provide lunchtime and afterschool sports provision which builds confidence and self esteem.

- We employed Futures to provide Art & Craft Activities during the Easter Holidays.
- We gave £1000 for play resources to our after school provision.

### **Pupil Premium funding 2012/13 £76,292**

We used our funding to do the following:

- Partially fund the salary of two part time teachers to support those children across the school who need additional support in maths and literacy skills.
- To fund a teaching assistant to provide 1:1 extra help for pupils with emotional needs.
- To fund a teaching assistant to provide Maths support for pupils in KS2 particularly for LAC children and other vulnerable groups.
- Use £5,000 to purchase reading books for guided reading in KS2 and for reading books for readers who are not yet reaching their potential
- Provide outside training for teachers to enrich and strengthen the teaching and learning in Literacy and Mathematics across the school
- Continue the subsidy of our theatre and workshop visits and class educational visits as last year.
- Continue to provide Sports Plus after school and lunchtime activities and further enrichment clubs such as computer club and art club.
- Subsidise an outdoor residential visit for our Year 5 and 6 pupils to build resilience, confidence and self esteem.
- Subsidise some of our collaborative learning activities with cluster schools.

### **Pupil Premium Funding 2013/14 £121,031**

We used pupil premium money:

- To fund an extra teaching assistant to provide extra help in the Early years.

- To fund a teaching assistant to provide 1:1 help for pupils with emotional needs.

- To fund a multi-agency liaison co-ordinator to provide support for our vulnerable pupils and their families.
- To fund resources to support two EAL pupils with little English.
- To improve our ICT resources. We purchased lap top computers for pupils to use during literacy and numeracy lessons.
- To provide outside training for teachers to enrich and strengthen the teaching and learning in Literacy and Mathematics across the school.
- To continue the subsidy of our theatre and workshop visits and class educational visits as last year, to help enrich their vocabulary and provide memorable learning experiences through the medium of drama which would in turn enrich their literacy experiences.
- Subsidise an outdoor residential visit for our Year 5 and 6 pupils to build resilience, confidence and self-esteem.
- To provide funding for Rock It tuition groups and their music exams at Forest Arts Centre as we feel that the Arts are a wonderful way to excite and enthuse children and also to subsidise some of our after school clubs such as computer club and art club
- We also subsidised ALL school visits and will continue to do so this year. Our school values life experiences and our staff know how much the children gain from visits to aid their learning.

- To continue the subsidy of our workshop visits, life around the world experiences and class educational visits as previous years, to help enrich their vocabulary and provide memorable learning experiences through the medium of drama which would in turn enrich their literacy experiences.
- To continue to subsidise an outdoor residential visit for our Year 6 pupils to build resilience, confidence and self-esteem.
- To continue to provide funding for Rock It tuition groups for all pupils in Year 2-5 and their music exams.
- To subsidise some of our after school clubs such as computer club and cooking club.
